# AMFA 2020 Scholarship Winners

Each year, AMFA National awards two scholarships to Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) students whose grades and essay stand out over other applicants. This year's winners are Harry Dugan and Christian Wood. Each applicant had to be currently enrolled in school for their A&P license, had to be a U.S. Citizen, and were required to submit an application including a 500word essay about "the importance of the FAA Hotline, ASAP, NASA ASRS, and safety reporting system as they relate to the aviation industry."

The National Executive Council chose Dugan from the Aviation Institute of Maintenance in Norfolkand and Wood from Embry-Riddle in Daytona Beach.

Normally, National Officers would present Dugan and Wood with their \$2500 scholarship in person, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the plaques and checks were sent to the their homes and their respective school was notified of their accomplishments. Campus visits will be set at a future date. Additionally, AMFA would announce the winners during the Aerospace Maintenance Competition in Dallas, but unfortunately the AMC was canceled this year. Harry Dugan is set to graduate in 2021, has a 4.0 grade point average and perfect attendance. He believes, "Safety is essential to the job. As an A&P Mechanic it will be my responsibility to make sure I operate in adherence with all safety standards. It is also important that I have a clear understanding of the following: the FAA Hotline, ASAP, NASA, ASRS, as

these are safety reporting systems in aviation. ... As I continue my education, I will keep learning more about my role in reporting safety concerns. It is exciting to see projected growth in the aviation field, and it is because of systems like these that that growth can occur!"

Christian Wood is set to graduate 2021. He has a 3.73 grade point average, was on the College of Aviation Dean's list in 2019, received the Honors Program Outstanding Service Award in 2018, and has been an Honors Program Peer Mentor since 2018. He was an Embry-Riddle Campus Safety and Security Crime Prevention Practitioner from 2017-2019 and a 2020 team competitor on the Emb-

ry-Riddle Society of Aerospace Technicians Team for the MRO Aerospace Maintenance Competition. Wood noted that "In order to cultivate a self-reporting culture, it is important that the reporting process be non-punitive. This encourages individuals to self-report on mistakes and errors without fear of punishment. Otherwise individuals would be reluctant to report their mistakes and the free flow of information would halt, preventing the industry as a whole from learning from its mistakes."

Congratulations to this year's recipients, and thank you to all who submitted applications. It is inspiring to see the passion and quality of the next generation of Aircraft Maintenance Technicians.
